4. Throughout "Our Time," Wideman talks about the difficulties involved in writing the history of another person, especially a close family member. What are these difficulties? How does he overcome them? How is he implicated in them?

5. Think about your memories of growing up in your family and neighborhood. Write down one or more important events or relationships you could write about. One of these could constitute a topic for your first paper.

6. Choose one topic, and write paragraphs about the settings and characters you would include, including details you will need to reveal about why the settings and characters that are important.

7. Construct a timeline of events related to the topic. How will you need to change the order of these events when you construct your narrative? Why?
